HealthWise

As many of you may be aware strokes have become something of an issue in our family of late. They can occur to either sex at any age so it is worth considering some ways of reducing the risk.

Fruit and vegetables are a good place to start because of the high fibre content which reduces blood pressure as well as other beneficial substances all of which lower cholesterol. Remember we are urged to eat five a day of each to get a good range of protective factors so try to increase your intake gradually. Whole-grains, like wholemeal bread, wholegrain pasta and brown rice can cut the risk factor by some 35 per cent. White versions of these foods have all been processed so that most of the goodness has been removed leaving a less healthy alternative. Nuts (especially walnuts), seeds and oily fish, plus soya and canola oil provide the essential oils which our body needs to function. It is the animal fats (they go solid when cooled) which tend to raise cholesterol levels and affect the constitution of the blood so keep those to a minimum and try to find other sources of protein.

Nicotine raises blood pressure and cigarette smoke makes your blood thicker and more likely to clot. The position with regard to alcohol is less clear in that while moderate amounts can reduce the risk of ischaemic stroke, any amount can cause some increase of haemorrhagic stroke, and heavy drinking raises the risk factor for both. Obesity increases the risk of stroke by fifty per cent so do try to shed those extra pounds. Taking HRT, according to the most recent studies, can increase your risk of having a stroke by forty one per cent in the first five years so those taking it should have regular checks or consider natural alternatives. Using good quality supplements plus garlic, ginko biloba and ginger can make a significant difference and using a good quality toothpaste and brushing regularly is more important than you think. Researchers have found that those with severe gum disease have a two fold risk of stroke as a result of clogged arteries. Remember the Aloe Vera Toothgel containing propolis which kills bacteria instantly and does not contain fluoride which researchers are now discovering can actually ruin teeth rather than being of benefit and there is increasing evidence in the link between fluoride and certain cancers - we will save that for another article!

New Pension Service

The Government has set up a new service - The Pension Service, part of the Department for Work and Pensions. The role of The Pension Service is to provide you with the service you deserve, delivered in a way that is convenient to you whether you are already a pensioner or are planning for your retirement, no matter how far off it might be.

The Pension Service will handle all telephone and postal claims, processing and enquiries about Retirement Pension, Minimum Income Guarantee (later Pension Credit) and related entitlements in 26 centres to be rolled out nationally. For Cambridgeshire the centre will be in Norwich. Primary contact with the Pension Service will be by telephone. The call will cost no more than a local telephone call for land based calls The Local Service will provide face-to-face contact for customers unable to transact business on the telephone, by post or electronically. We will provide this face-to-face service where it is needed. The Local Service will also work with other organisations to deliver pension-related services. We aim to publicise information about benefit entitlements and the Pension Service by setting up information points for leaflet display, by initiating regular 'drop in' events i.e. in libraries round the county or by offering presentations to Pensioner and other groups. From the Three Rivers Curate: Mike Banyard

What a superb welcome to Helen and myself in both Snailwell and Chippenham as I take up the post of Assistant Curate in the Three Rivers Group, and start our new life in the Vicarage. The fete at Snailwell meant that we could meet many who live there and the theme of Chippenham's entry to the Village of the Year competition is, "Chippenham: A great place to live", and our experience in both villages has been that they both are great places to be. A wonderful sense of community. So a huge *thank you* to everybody who has made us so welcome here and who are encouraging us in ministry. Your hospitality has been stunning. My ordination as a Deacon in Ely Cathedral on June 28th marked a

significant step in my own journey of faith, and it was tremendous to be surrounded by so many friends and family who supported me there. After twenty-eight years as a secondary school teacher in Ely, Cyprus, Hong Kong and Germany, and as a church worker at the Anglican Cathedral in Hong Kong, it was time to accept that my particular vocation was to minister full time in the church here in England. So here we are, living in the Vicarage in Chippenham, ministering mainly here and in Snailwell and working alongside Anne Haselhurst the Vicar of Fordham who supervises and leads me in the next stage of my training. We are delighted to be here. Change can be a great challenge, though it often provides opportunities too. Returning to College in Cambridge in 2001 to study theology in preparation for ordination marked a significant change for me. Westcott House, in Jesus Lane, is a theological college with around 60 students on the first stage of their training to be priests in the Church of England. There is a wide age range, in my year from 23 to 58, both men and women. Studying, working and living alongside such a diverse group was a great challenge. Sometimes it seemed overwhelming. Learning Greek at my age was difficult! Writing essays again and making presentations were skills to be re-learned.

Nothing like the challenges which so many face though, especially in times of loss or when life just seems too difficult and not taking the path we either expected or sought. Where can we find acceptance and under-standing? Where can we find, not simple answers, but a sympathetic, listening ear, gentleness, kindness, patience and support? The church is here for you, to worship God, and to live in the way Jesus Christ showed us, building community, welcoming the stranger, working for peace and justice in our hearts, in our families and in our communities.
