Volunteer Responders wanted for MAGPAS

The Mid-Anglia General Practitioner Accident Service (MAGPAS) has been providing emergency support to the Ambulance Service since 1971. This year we are launching the First Responder Scheme throughout Cambridgeshire and we urgently need your help.

All responders will be trained in first aid and in the use of specialised heart monitoring equipment (defibrillator) to shock a heart in the event of a cardiac arrest. Each team member on call would attend an incident after being activated via the ambulance service control room, and would be trained and equipped with a First Aid kit, oxygen, defibrillator, two-way radio, mobile phone or bleeper.

This is an exciting opportunity to become involved in your own community and to provide vital time to a casualty, often saving a life, until the ambulance arrives. The Community First Responder Scheme is designed to complement and work alongside the emergency Ambulance Service and will NOT replace services delivered by the Ambulance Service.

Pastoral Letter from the Rural Dean

Dear Friends,

I hope that greeting is not too presumptuous, but having now 'presided' over two interregna at Chippenham & Snailwell as Rural Dean, I feel I know you very well! I had hoped to be able to announce the appointment of a new 'vicar' for you, but sadly the copy deadline is just too early for that. The person appointed will be a Group Priest with specific responsibility for Chippenham & Snailwell, within the new, informal, Three Rivers Group Ministry, which comprises the parishes of Chippenham, Fordham, Isleham, Kennett & Snailwell. (The three rivers being the Lark, Kennett and Snail). The idea of the group is that resources can be shared and some things done more easily e.g. church magazine, study groups, confirmation preparation, young peoples work, school involvement. To that end a group council will be set up, meeting three times per annum, in addition to the local parochial church councils. The 'staffing' of the group will be your new 'vicar', plus the Revd Anne Haslehurst (Vicar of Fordham & Priest-in-Charge of Kennett), the Revd Christopher Goodwins (Priest-in-Charge of Isleham), Mrs Carol Taylor (Reader), and Mr David Ball (Reader in the Diocese of St Edmundsbury & Ipswich at Freckenham).

The group comes into being with an official commissioning on Friday 26th April at 7.30pm in Isleham Church, when Bishop John Flack will lead the service. Please feel welcome to attend this important occasion.

With all good wishes for this new year, and a new chapter in the life of the Church here.

Words cannot convey my gratitude to the people of Chippenham and especially the church community, for the wonderful support which you gave to Jenny and me during her illness and to me personally after her death. It has been a sad and bewildering time, but the unfailing love which you have shown throughout has made it much less hard to bear than I would have thought possible. Jenny's funeral was a demonstration of how in a Christian community it is possible for sorrow and joy to exist together and reminded me of William Blake's words, which I must have quoted before: "Joy and woe are woven fine, A clothing for the soul divine".

I am so glad that Jenny's ashes are buried in Chippenham churchyard where I hope they will be joined in due course by my own. We were richly blessed when we were led to Chippenham, which we both soon came to regard as our spiritual home.

It was heart-warming to see so many Chippenham people at Michele Williams' funeral at Brington. It really is true that "in the midst of life we are in death". Michele was almost exactly half Jenny's age and Andy needs all our prayers as he looks after Bobby and faces the days ahead without her. I shall always remember an American Evening at the Vicarage when Michele's quiet charm captivated us all.

2001 was a bad year, what with September 11th and many other unexpected deaths: but there must surely be quite a party going on in Heaven.
