HealthWise

As regular readers to my column will be aware I try to cover seasonal and topical issues in the field of health and nutrition. If you have been reading the papers lately you will probably have come across articles following the report in the Journal of Applied Toxicology which is putting deodorants and antiperspirants firmly back in the public eye again.

Initial reports have highlighted the presence of aluminium and its association with early onset on dementia, in particular Alzheimer's Disease, breast cancer and the breakdown on the immune system. Aluminium, often accompanied by zirconium, two of the most commonly used elements in anti-perspirants and deodorants, have been found in human breast tumours.

Numbers of breast cancer sufferers have risen from 20,000 in the seventies to more than 40,000 today, and increasingly it is affecting men as well as women. Heavy metals such as aluminium are extremely difficult for the body to get rid of and remain stored in the tissue indefinitely with the potential to do harm in the future.

The current report also highlights the presence of parabens, from deodorants, in breast tumours. Parabens are usually added to products to prolong the shelf life and are not a necessary part of the product for any other purpose. The products which I sell ever increasing amounts of do not contain any of these substances. The Aloe Evershield Deodorant Stick costs £5.26p and lasts for 6 to 9 months with daily use. The Subdue deodorant (Neways) contains a selection of herbs and is a roll-on which costs £4.11 and lasts around two months. Neways products are all made from natural ingredients and are the safest range of products on the market I have come across. There are other aluminium products on the market but they are still difficult to find in High Street stores.

Black box recycling and deliveries

The Parish Councils of both villages have received complaints that some residents haven't been given recycling boxes. It seems that the District Council's policy is to collect recycling items only from properties within the 30mph limits of the village. We have asked our District Councillors, John Abbott and Michael Allan, to try and remedy this. It is not fair that people living out of the centre of the village get a less good service.

The next few collection days are February 4th and 18th, March 3rd, 17th and 31st.

Do carry on recycling your bottles, paper and cans at Chippenham Village Hall site as well as through the boxes. We recently received £373 for the recycling in the first six months of 2003, half of which is donated to the Village Hall, so it is very worthwhile.

Vacancy for a Councillor

Snailwell Parish Council has a vacancy for a Councillor following the recent death of John Bye. John served on the Parish Council for 2½ years and made a valuable contribution for which we are very grateful. Now we have to co-opt a new Councillor to serve until the next Parish Council elections in 2007.

You are eligible if you are over 21, either British, Irish or an EU citizen, and live or work in Snailwell parish or live within 3 miles of the parish.

The cleaner does his best, but this anti-social behaviour makes the shelter really unpleasant and of course impossible to use as a waiting area. The light has finally been repaired after a long wait, which may make a difference.

Please remember that the shelter was built as a memorial and is meant as an amenity for the whole village. Your thoughtless action causes expense to the Council (and therefore to all rate-payers) and unnecessary effort and distress to the whole community.

Neighbourhood Watch News
