Health Wise

As you all know I am rather keen on nutrition and fond of telling everyone what they should be eating. It occurs to me that I should start one step back from that and discuss the actual process of eating.

Many people proudly tell me that they are very fast eaters. Indeed the words "grab a bite to eat" has become very familiar in our culture of fast food, busy lives, high stress...need I continue? However many people do not stop to consider just how many problems they are storing up for themselves in the future by not making proper time to choose and eat healthy food. The most important part of the eating is in the chewing not in swallowing food as quickly as possible. I hear people rushing each other and especially their children, forcing them to swallow food without really chewing it properly then shortly after reaching for the indigestion tablets.

The process of digestion should begin with the thought of what we are going to eat. If we are hungry just the thought of something we like causes the digestive juices in the mouth to start to flow. Then comes the smell of the food. This is when people say that something "makes their mouth water". That is exactly what food should do. When your mouth is watering this is the digestive juices flowing which break down the food particles so that they can be readily digested and all the various nutrients absorbed. As this is happening the food should be eaten slowly! Every mouthful should be chewed thoroughly, some say up to forty times, before swallowing so that the digestive juices can do their work properly.

This may all seem rather trivial to those who eat quickly and do not appear any the worse for it. However digestive problems are slow to develop but once you have a problem it is very difficult to reverse. If any of you suffer from IBS, diverticulitis or even indigestion you will know how uncomfortable that can be, even painful and causing huge problems for some. A choice of good food, plenty of fruit and vegetables plus whole grains is a great start and practice eating it correctly and you could find a world of difference.

They still till their fields, look after their animals and eat the contaminated produce of their labours. The children, who are particularly vulnerable, are ingesting so much contamination that the numbers developing leukaemia and cancer continue to rise.

One of the ways the charity helps these children is by bringing them to the UK for a holiday. They estimate that one month with a family here boosts a child's immune system to an extent that their life expectancy is increased by several years. Have you seen Mel Gibson's The Passion of the Christ? If, like me, you have not yet seen it, then perhaps we all should, even if it will be very testing, and we may find it harrowing in the extreme, and at times have to avert our eyes from the screen. For, from all accounts, and especially those who HAVE seen it, it will prove to be challenging to the very core of our being. Because we might also find the film tremendously tender. It has been described to me this past week as the greatest love story of all time. Whether you have seen it or not, it would be helpful to talk about what it means, and the implications for what you actually believe. Do stop me around the villages and ask!

It's the time of year for powerful images isn't it? There are signs of new life bursting from the ground, and in the air around us. Daffodils, which herald the spring with such grace and beauty; our thoughts are naturally lifted high when we see them along our streets and in our gardens. The birds in our gardens, which seem to be building nests in every shrub and tree; in ours it is the collared doves, building high in the silver birch, sitting faithfully until the eggs are hatched.

And at this great Festival of Easter, new life and resurrection is the central theme. That most compelling of images in our lives, the cross on which Jesus suffered and died, is a forceful image for our Christian journey. For who knows what cross each of us has to bear in our lives; who knows what burdens we all bear; and who can we let into the dark places of our lives, where only the very few are allowed in, and which often ourselves we shy away from opening to others? For the cross on which Jesus hung and died, is for Christians, the central act of self-giving love. Jesus died for us all. He suffered and experienced the very depths of despair. He even felt abandoned by God, when he uttered from the cross the opening words from Psalm 22, My God, My God, why have you forsaken me? Sometimes we too experience that sense of abandonment in the worst moments of our lives. Bur Jesus died that we might have life in abundance. That we might live in the light of his great sacrifice. For Jesus has experienced the very depths of despair that humankind has to bear, and has come through that, to a new risen life in union with God our Creator.

Please join us, on April 11th at St Peter's, Snailwell at 9.30am, and/or at St Margaret's, Chippenham at 11am, to celebrate this most momentous event in history. See you there!

Dear residents,

Over the past few months the press coverage on WildTracks has sometimes been inaccurate. I am writing, therefore, to give you the facts — and because I feel that many of the positive things that happen here have not been fairly represented.

<u>Planning</u> It has been alleged that we do not have a planning consent for Karting and Rallycross. On the contrary. These permissions were received on 1st February 1995 and 10th January 1997, and we completed the requisite circuit last October. Prior to its construction, we did not ask for further planning permission because the Planners advised our contractors that there was no objection to these engineering works. However, we are already rectifying this with a retrospective application.

Noise One of the chief fears of local residents, and one which I fully understand as I live in Chippenham, is increased noise. The Planners have now asked us to submit an Environmental Impact Assessment together with the above Planning Application, and as part of this we have instructed one of the leading companies in this field to carry out the noise survey.

They have already monitored noise levels at a number of relevant locations, taking readings on a 'worst case' scenario when the wind was blowing in the direction of the village. The consultants report reads as follows: 'At all locations, the background noise levels (WildTracks) were dominated by road traffic noise on the A11'. We also tried the tannoy system and they go on to say; 'the PA system was not audible at any of the monitoring locations including that nearest to WildTracks'. Copies of this report are available for inspection. Motocross has been held at Chippenham now for over 25 years, and until very recently we have had no complaints.



Over the past ten years, we have taken the following steps to reduce noise:

- Over 4,000 trees have been planted, and banking put in around the Motocross circuit.
- Our operating hours at weekends have been voluntarily reduced. We now close at 4.00pm, instead of 6.00pm, and 5.00pm at weekends as allowed by our existing planning consent.
- The number of Motocross meetings has been reduced from 10 to 3 in any one year

Bunding or Banking We have recently installed an earth 'bund' along the new kart circuit - the effect of which will, according to the experts, reduce noise levels by over 30%.

We did not make a planning application for this, as the Chippenham Parish Council, when consulted, told us that they welcomed any measures to reduce noise levels. We have now been asked to do so – which again we are doing.

Future activities at WildTracks.

We hope, eventually, to be able to run occasional Rallycross and Supermoto meetings at WildTracks on the new circuit. Because of space restrictions, these events would take the place of the regular Motocross practices already allowed.

Noise from these sources would be far less than that at our weekly Motocross sessions, when we can have up to 120 bikes here at the same time. (At a Rallycross meeting no more than 8 cars participate at any one time; while for Supermoto events there are unlikely to be more than 20 bikes on the track simultaneously).

In accordance with the sports' governing bodies, noise levels are – and will continue to be – carefully monitored to ensure that they do not exceed the guidelines laid down.

General.

- We employ 10 people from the area on a full time basis, with over 20 part time marshals on our books as well. We also support at least 20 different local charities and schools, and spend in excess of £400,000 a year exclusively in the local economy.
- Already more than 500 young people visit us on an average weekend for Motorcross, so we run weekly training schools for junior beginners.
- Our research shows that at least 95% of our visitors access us from the A11/A14 and immediate slip roads
 not through the local villages.

WildTracks provides enormous enjoyment for families, corporate groups and thousands of young people in the area - in a location that complies perfectly with Government guidelines.
