'If I'd have been organised and written this last week, I'd have spoken of the lovely daffs out by my front door, the gentle move from thick woolly jumpers to thinner ones, and of the sunshine perfectly illuming all the dust in my house; but as it is, we had snow yesterday, the thick jumpers are back on and the radiators stoically pumping out heat. Life is a bit unpredictable!

But, so are most things! Just when I think I've got something sorted, something completely out of left field interrupts me! A priest once said to me – if you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans! What we have in store for ourselves is so often not what God has for us; and my experience happily is that God's way is often deeply challenging but also ultimately transforming. God calls us into life, and this isn't necessarily the easy way or the straightforward way, or even the obvious way; but it is God's way. Sometimes it takes years to see the bigger picture, sometimes we see straight away, and sometimes I suspect it will take until we reach Heaven to see things from God's perspective. But God's plans for us are surprising and unique to each of us.

As you read this Easter is imminent (or even already been and gone, depending on when you find 5 mins to sit with your cuppa and peruse this fine publication!), and Easter is all about change and transformation. The totally unexpected happened. The disciples thought Jesus had gone, they mourned, they were angry, they were hurt and disappointed – emotions we've all felt in our own grief. But then the most radical and surprising thing happened – the tomb was empty; Jesus was and is alive! Initially they all though the disciples were drunk, so ridiculous was the notion that Jesus had risen. But, not drunk just transformed form death to life. There was celebration, there was rejoicing, tears and weeping, hugs and radiant grins.

Death was not to be feared, dying and the tomb were no longer the end. God had written a different final chapter – a chapter which would go on and on forever.

SPEEDWATCH RESULTS FEB 2011-FEB 2012

Chippenham and Snailwell

The results for the past 12 months of Speedwatch activity in Chippenham and Snailwell are very similar. The Speedwatch volunteers recorded 23% of vehicles that pass through both villages travel in excess of 32 mph.

Chippenham had 18 visits with 2100 vehicles recorded and 483 were over 32 mph. Snailwell had 12 visits over the same period with 1410 vehicles and 328 speeders.

In both villagers the vast majority of drivers who were caught speeding were from outside the 2 villages.

Although the last few results in both villagers do show that traffic is slowing down, we need to be more active and therefore are requesting more volunteers to join us.

EMR Update

European Metal Recycling is situated in the parish of Fordham.

Regular EMR liaison meetings are held to discuss noise issues from the site, including local villages and Snailwell. The latest EMR Liaison meeting was held on 2nd February 2012 and included representatives from the Local, District and County Council, Officials and EMR.

The Operations team from EMR and the Council officials confirmed that they were close to fulfilling all of the planning conditions required so that a barrier could be erected between EMR and the village to abate the noise from the site.

However the board of EMR who need to approve the cost of building the barrier have queried whether the noise from the site has now been abated. They claim that the noise was caused by train loading and that no train loading has taken place since September 2011 when their customer Thames Steel ceased trading.

ECDC are however still receiving noise complaints about the site from villagers who experience high levels of noise at various times.

LITTER & REFUSE

Snailwell village Parish Council have been contacted recently from several concerned residents regarding the amount/type of litter left out for collection, often several days prior to the village's scheduled collection day.

This is just to remind all residents that the scheduled collection day for refuse in Snailwell is:

WEDNESDAY *except for changes on Bank Holidays

Black sack waste is collected bi-weekly: eg 12/4/12, 25/4/12, 10/5/12, 23/5/12, 7/6/12

Recycling and brown sack waste is collected on the alternate week: eg 4/4/12, 18/4/12, 2/5/12, 16/5/12, 30/5/12, 13/6/12

Collection material should be ready for collection by 7am on the specified day but not before 6pm the evening prior. Extra or larger amounts of waste can be disposed of for a small cost at Newmarket Recycling Centre or free at Mildenhall Recycling Centre.

SNAILWELL VILLAGE TRAFFIC CALMING APPLICATIONS

Snailwell village Parish Council have applied for a traffic calming application from the jointly funded Minor Highways Improvements.

- This application is for chicanes or raised areas to slow down the traffic at the top of the village where Short Road joins Newmarket Road and The Green.

The maximum amount that can be applied for is £10,000 per scheme, however if this application is successful the Parish Council will be responsible for 10% of the cost.

FROM April the force is embarking on a new structure for local policing, abolishing the current three divisions for six district areas in line with local authority boundaries.

This change will allow police to work closer with partner agencies and deliver a much more locally-focused policing service.

The priority remains frontline services and the force's commitment to bringing offenders to justice and keeping people safe.

The structure was developed to maintain and enhance the level of operational policing tailored to local needs. It is part of the operation to redesign the whole structure of the force and ensure we reduce costs and maintain the level of service the public receive.



Each district will have a team of officers and staff who currently perform neighbour-hood policing, response and local crime investigation functions.

East Cambridgeshire will be run by Area Commander Chief Inspector Russell Waterston and a team of sergeants, PCs and PCSOs will continue to cover the area. The changes will see the number of PCs covering East Cambs increasing from 34 to 42, the number of sergeants will rise by two to 10 and the area will have a dedicated crime manager. Most of the officers are already in post ready for the official changeover.

The Three Rivers Community Car Scheme

provides people with a door to door lift for essential journeys, driven by a volunteer using their own car. The passenger pays a contribution to the fuel and running costs of the car. Lifts are provided to appointments (eg. to the surgery or hospital, optician and dentist), plus help with visiting friends and relatives in hospital or with shopping
