As I looked through my window the other day, a fox cub idly sauntered across the grass. In broad daylight, obviously looking for food. I haven't yet any chickens, but in thinking about it, I have looked very carefully at the security I think I might need to keep the hungry fox from the tasty chickens. And then, if I watched carefully, was patient and waited, I counted at least six birds' nests in the hedges around the garden. Our very own Springwatch!

And for me life at present has been about waiting and noticing. Seeing those signs which in a busy life might just pass me by. Life which is clearly all around me. So I have learned to wait, to watch, to stop, even if the stopping is very brief and see, really see what is there before my eyes. About how others are. About how they are feeling. About their experiences.

Jesus did that and showed us how to do it. He saw to the very heart of an issue. What a person was really thinking. What their words really meant. And that it seems to me is a good example for me to fall in with. To really listen to what another person is saying to me. Trusting another deeply enough to be prepared to be vulnerable, to open up to our deepest thoughts, fears, hopes and expectations. We truly are then on holy ground in our encounters with each other.

Fundraising activities were very successful and special thanks to all who supported them so generously.



Highways.

The Parish Council has secured funding from the Highways Dept to provide traffic calming measures for the High Street. The PC met with the Highways Dept to discuss the various options available. Some have been rejected on the basis of cost; for example, changing the road layout, or installing electronic signage. Others such as rumble strips and speed humps, ruled out based on noise. The police have rejected the Parish Council's request to designate the High Street as a speed camera zone. Based on their data there isn't sufficient speeding to warrant the request!

The scheme which will go ahead is the installation of village 'gates' at both the Parkside and Fordham Road ends of the High Street. These white gates, together with new larger clockface style village name signage will help to raise awareness that motorists are entering a village. Existing signs will be replaced with yellow back signs and 30 mph roundels will be painted on the road.

The Parish Council appreciate that these measures will not deter the determined speeder but hope that they will encourage the more considerate motorist to obey the speed limit and therefore lower the overall speed of traffic passing through the village.

Delivery schedule for new waste collection bins

Services will be introduced across the district over a 10 week period. It is intended that bins will be delivered to households in the week prior to service commencement to avoid problems with overflows on first collection dates.

For example Round E (Chippenham & Snailwell) will receive delivery of bins the week commencing 30th
