# The Parish Churches of Chippenham and Snailwell

From the Three Rivers Curate: Mike Banyard

Tis the season for weddings! There are more planned for all the churches in our Three Rivers Group, (that's Chippenham, Fordham, Isleham, Kennett and Snailwell) than for the past two or three years put together. It is great to be part of so many celebrations, and to share with the couples their love, joy and commitment. The planning takes up a great deal of time, sometimes several months, and then there is the cost. It is all worth it, for, as family and friends gather to witness this very public statement of love and commitment, we catch up with folks we have not seen for a very long time, remark on how the children have grown, and marvel that some of our friends seem not to have aged at all.

At their heart, weddings are a sign of love, and of co-operation with God in his loving purposes for humankind. "God is love and those who live in love, live in God and God lives in them," the Bible tells us. We see the results of turning away from God, of turning away from love, on our TV screens every night. Scenes of violence I have observed in the days as I write this, with increasing levels of violence on all sides in Israel and Lebanon and Palestine. No one wins. All lose.

Living in love and peace with each other may sometimes prove difficult, but this vision of love at the core of the universe empowers us to live as God wants us to live, being true to ourselves, worshipping the true God, not some idol or other, and loving and serving our neighbour wherever we find them.

At the churches in the Three Rivers Group, change is on the way. The Rev'd Anne Haselhurst, Vicar at Fordham and Priest-in-charge at Kennett and Isleham, has moved to Scotland to take up the post of Rector at Cupar, Fife, and Ladybank. She was instituted into that post in the middle of July and some went up there to witness that occasion. There is a gap now, we need another priest to join the team to minister to the five churches, and to the villages we serve. The Churchwardens and Parochial Church Councils who are responsible for the churches at present, are discussing the way forward. If you have any views about what kind of priest might join our team then please do talk in Chippenham to Peter Maxwell and/or Nicola Heather, and in Snailwell to Bryan Orme and/or Maureen Howes. I am also very ready and willing to listen to your views too, so do please be in touch.

It's also the season of holidays.....so do have a good, happy and safe time, and return re-created and refreshed for the Autumn!

#### EAST CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS

#### Car parking in Ely

After weeks of Council debate, the Liberal Democrat Group was successful in getting the Conservatives to withdraw their proposal to take over a section of Cathedral land in order to extend Broad Street car park. The Lib Dems were supported in their belief that this would be a wrong move on several accounts by letters from the general public, a number of which were published in the Ely Standard. A letter from English Heritage Inspector, David Eve, finally clinched the outcome. In it he said: "Taken as a whole, this area is important in separating the City from the Cathedral. The extension would have an impact on the historic environment, both in terms of appearance and archaeological deposits".

The Council is now having discussion with the railway company where we hope a car park with a minimum of 100 spaces would be beneficial to both Ely residents and the whole district. More parking at the station would surely free up some of the spaces in the main city car parks where commuters currently have to park when the station parking is full.

#### Section 106

An expression that seems to cause much confusion, Section 106 has recently been the subject of an Overview and Scrutiny Committee. Cllr. Michael Allan was able to get the agreement for a Working Party that is going to address the issue. Parish Council Chairmen and Clerks of the District will be invited to a briefing in the coming autumn. Very basically, Section 106 works like this.

- Planning permissions involving nine or more dwellings are assessed to see if they are likely to place undue strain on the community facilities infrastructure.
- 2 If they do, then the Council enters into negotiations with the developer to secure reasonable contribution towards necessary improvements.
- 2 Parish Councils are then advised of funds available and how to apply for it.
- 3 The funds can only be spent on projects arising from the consequence of the development.
- 4 In every instance, the process must be transparent and fair to all and be felt to be necessary, viable, and to deliver the required social and community benefits.

#### **Housing Growth**

Another controversial subject is the increase in the number of houses being built in the District. A total of 855 new homes were completed in 2005 – 2006, which is more than any other Cambridgeshire district. This record underlines the importance of the Council continuing to work with infrastructure providers, developers and Government to ensure that services are in place to support new growth.

#### **Youth Disability Sports**

On Friday 16th June, over 250 children with varying disabilities competed in the first ever Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Youth Games PLUS at the St Ivo Leisure Centres, St Ives.

Sports DeC, the organisation responsible for supporting sports events on behalf of the District Council encouraged many of our disabled youth to take part, several competing for the first time. It is hoped they will now be encouraged to join local sports clubs that cater for disabled athletes, and that the Youth Games PLUS will become an annual event.
