Well it's a touch warmer, and the rain seems to have ceased for a few moments. One of the many joys of our time living in Cyprus in the mid to late 1980's was the fact that you could plan your summer, for it would stop raining usually at the end of March, and then not start again till November. And of course with that, everything became very brown, and often in the mountains fires would start easily and then villagers up there would have to be very vigilant. But that's enough of the weather!

It's the wedding season in our churches. They are great occasions, everyone scrubs up well and looks the part, nerves come to the fore, and that special moment when the happy couple make those vows are very exceptional. And often couples choose words by St Paul from his letter to the Corinthians. Corinth was a fairly seedy place in his day, and in his letter, Paul states quite clearly what true, real love is all about.

Paul writes. "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrong doing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things. Love never ends."

Now this, it seems to me, is what the foundation of all our lives, single, married, living committed lives together, is all about. Jesus tells us that there are really only two commandments which should guide our lives on earth, Love God and Love your neighbour as you love yourself. Challenging words, simple and apparently straightforward. I cannot think of any better guide to life here on earth. And we know, because we are human, that this is the gold standard, that this is what is at the heart of all our relationships, and that yes, sometimes, we will fall short of these ideals. But without that vision, and without trying to live up to these ideals, how will we live together in peace and harmony, and how will we ever become the human beings we are made to be?

Even More Savings!

As mentioned in the last newsletter, we have a group of over 50 addresses, and together have made good savings. However ACRE, a charity linked to Cambs Council, also read the newsletter, and has written to me inviting us to join them. They have a much bigger number of members and have managed to get deals between 1p and 2p per litre better than I have, each time we have ordered.

The advantage of joining them is the potential of saving a further £20 per 1,000 litres. The disadvantage is that you have to pay £20 per year upfront.

So if, like me you buy over 1,500 litres per year, you would be better off to go with ACRE.

They insist on a local coordinator which I am prepared to do. So if you want to take advantage of ACRE, all you need do is fill in the application form, pay the money and inform me. Then order in the normal way by sending an email or hand written note to me.

If you do not want to join ACRE, I will continue to run the old co-op exactly as before, for as long as it is feasable, but with these lower volumes I may not get as good a saving as before.

I will continue to publish a deadline as before. If you want to join ACRE follow this link; http://www.cambsacre.org.uk/community-oil-buying-scheme.php, then just let me know when you have joined.

The deadline for the next order is midnight 23rd August. If you are in ACRE the delivery will be week commencing 3rd September, or soon afterwards. If not it will be week commencing 28th August.

The Festival celebrates and promotes the huge breadth of work covered by the University of Cambridge across the Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. Speakers at the host of debates and talks include the legendary BBC World Affairs Editor John Simpson, China expert Martin Jacques, *Radio 4* Controller Gwyneth Williams and Executive Editor of *The Economist*, Daniel Franklin.

Saturday 27 October is packed full of talks and debates for adults and workshops and performances for children. There will be performances by three acclaimed authors and poets, Lauren Child, best known for her *Charlie and Lola series*; Andy Stanton of *Mr Gum* fame; and legendary Rasta and performance poet, Benjamin Zephaniah.
