- The minimum delivery is 500 litres; this is a Trading Standards ruling because of the accuracy of lorry gauges. To get the minimum ask for 500 litres; do not ask for a "top up" because you might get a "fill up".

Please note the following:-

1. The price will not be known until the order has been placed.
2. The supplier may ring for payment prior to delivery or bill you directly after delivery.
3. Be aware that most suppliers add 2% to the invoice for credit card payments (debit cards or cheques attract no surcharge)
4. James will confirm that he has received your order. If you receive no confirmation please re-contact him as he will not have received your order.

The main role of a Parish Councillor is to represent the views of all residents within your parish. The Government policy is to devolve more decision making to local councils so it is a great opportunity to make a difference and successfully tackle village issues.

SNAILWELL VILLAGE PROTECTED ROAD VERGES

Cambridgeshire County Council has informed all Parish Councils that they will no longer be carrying out any verge cutting of the protected road verges. Their current grass cutting regime is that they carry out 3 visibility cuts per season. A visibility cut includes cutting at bends, junctions and a single swathe cut adjacent to the carriageway edges. All Parishes' have been informed they no longer intend to carry out a full cut of any road verges. The verge affected in Snailwell Parish is south of the Snailwell Stud to the railway bridge (Short Road).

VILLAGE TREES

On the 26th October 2011 the "The Wild Service Tree" was planted. This was kindly donated by Sophie Waddilove and her brother Jake in memory of their mother, Jane Waddilove, who loved the village so much. The Parish Council are very grateful to Sophie and Jake for their very generous gift which will be a lasting memory to Jane.

Having gained one new tree we are sadly losing another as the Red Horse Chestnut on the verge by the lower green in Church Lane will have to be felled due to disease. This was confirmed by the Tree Officer, Cathy White from ECDC. One branch has fallen in high winds and Cathy was concerned that other branches could follow.

The remaining Red Chestnuts will be reviewed by Highways but the Parish are hopeful that these will only require pruning. The replacements for the Red Chestnut and the 2 Sorbus trees that have died will be discussed at the next Parish meeting at the end of November. Further details to follow.

WINTER GRITTING

ECDC recently informed us that any resident choosing to clear snow or ice from outside their, or anyone else's property or the road would be liable for any incidents, if their efforts were deemed to actually make the pavement less safe than it was with the snow and ice undisturbed.

Following this Cambs County Council has organised training sessions providing equipment to villages and guidance to ensure any gritting/or snow and ice clearing can be taken upon in the most safe and effective manner possible. Snailwell Parish Council are happy to inform residents that two Parish Councillors have already completed the training courses but we are looking for further residents who are willing to attend future courses.



Your top six tips for keeping warm and well

- 1 Heat your home well.** By setting your heating to the right temperature, 21c during the day and 18c at night, you can keep your home warm and your bills as low as possible
- 2 Get financial support.** There are grants, benefits and sources of advice available to make your home more energy efficient, improve your heating or help with bills. It's worthwhile claiming all the benefits you are entitled to.
- 3 Eat well.** Food is a vital source of energy, which helps to keep your body warm. Try to make sure that you have hot meals and drinks regularly throughout the day.
- 4 Get a flu jab.** You can get a free jab from your GP to protect against seasonal flu if you are over 65, have a long-term health condition or are pregnant.
- 5 Look after yourself.** Keeping active is important for your health. But if you do go out in cold weather it is important that you wear extra clothes to make sure that you wrapped up warmly. During very cold and icy weather conditions it is safer for older people, very young children and anyone with health problems to avoid going out.
- 6 Look after your family and neighbours.** If you have an older relative or neighbour look out for them during winter to ensure that they are well, warm and able to have hot meals and drinks.

• **Re-ablement**

Being independent following an operation or illness

If you or someone you care for requires social care support following an illness or operation, this would traditionally have been provided by a care assistant providing direct care to the person in need.

Since September 2010 a new service, re-ablement, has been providing support to enable older people who have poor physical or mental health following illness or an operation to live in their own homes.

Re-ablement programmes can last for as little as a few days and generally don't exceed six weeks. The ethos of re-ablement is to encourage people to do things for themselves rather than having things done for them. There is no charge to the individual as long as they are participating in the programme.

Re-ablement is now being offered to a wider client group including new service users with a physical disability and new occupational therapy referrals. Future development of the service will look at assisting older people who already have a care package but due to illness or physical issues may now require a higher level of support.

Some of the issues you have asked us to address next

- Provide information about enforcement action that can be taken for fly tipping.
- Write to schools in the Panel area about parking issues and encourage walking to school where possible.
- Take action against people breaking the speed limit across the panell area
