

Well as I sit here and write this letter, the late October storm is passing through the village, with gusting winds and much rain. And it threatens to get worse before it all calms down.

POLICE are urging residents to take crime prevention measures this winter as part of a campaign against burglary.

With clocks having gone back and the days getting shorter, burglars may target homes mid-to-late afternoon and will look for properties that are unoccupied.

Burglars target homes that seem empty so it's important to make homes look occupied. Properties are generally broken into from the rear because the burglar doesn't want to be seen. T all fencing, noisy gravel, spiky hedges and an alarm system all help. Windows and doors should always be locked when there is no one at home.

Remove keys from window and door locks, but keep them in a safe place to know where to find them in the event of an emergency.

Never leave items such as keys, bags and money on show through a window. Consider the position of key racks or shelves next to doors and ensure that they cannot be reached through the letter box.

Use timer switches to turn on lights and radios when you are going to be away from your house, consider the use of lights at the front and rear of your property that are activated when someone approaches.

Use bolts and padlocks on side gates. Consider chaining together all high value items stored in outbuildings, Perhaps use of a wireless alarm or link your shed or garage into an existing home intruder alarm system.

Check their home insurance policies to ensure their property meets the security standards required.

Residents are also urged to sign up to eCops to receive email updates from their local policing team. Follow the link on the force website. Suspicious activity should be reported to the police on 101, or 999 if a crime is in progress, Crimestoppers, anonymously, on 0800 555111, or through Neighbourhood Watch.

#### THE FOODBANK



Being ill so you can't work, or finding your benefits haven't been paid when they should, is a nightmare scenario however many people you need to

feed. So the Soham branch of the Ely foodbank, run by local churches for local communities, is welcome news.

The nights are starting to get longer and the number of people coming through the door is going up. There are all sorts of reasons why people find themselves in difficulties, but more often then not it is due to problems with the local social services and the welfare system. With very rare exceptions people are genuinely in need of help. They are given food for three days, and a chance to talk to someone who is completely non-judgemental over a cup of tea or coffee, so they can be directed to appropriate support agencies.

We're collecting food for the foodbank in Chippenham at St Margaret's Church. Or if you're in the Co-op in either Isleham or Fordham, why not buy something extra and put it in the box there. Items need to be packaged or tinned, with a shelf life of at least 3 months. There are flyers which you can pick up to see what kinds of things are most needed, but as Christmas approaches, festive items will also be appreciated. If you're interested in finding out more, whether you're in a difficult

situation yourself, or you might consider volunteering to help (and you don't have to go to church to volunteer), go along to the Salvation Army Hall, Bushels Lane, Soham between 10 and 11 on a Thursday morning. http://www.elyfoodbank.org.uk/ info@elyfoodbank.org.
