# A Helping Hand



A FREE easy to use guide to community transport

What is a dial-a-ride service or a voluntary car scheme and am I eligible? If you've ever thought this then help is at hand. Cambridgeshire County Council has just published their indispensable Community Transport Guide for 2006 / 2007. And it's completely FREE.

The guide explains exactly what community transport is and who can use it; how it works along-side conventional public transport; and lists by district details of all community transport schemes operating throughout Cambridgeshire.

Laid out in an accessible reference format the guide is easy to read and understand. Three sections provide clear and concise information.

The first section describes the various types of community transport schemes throughout Cambridgeshire. Covering how they meet the needs of the communities they serve, how they operate and who can use such schemes. The section also has useful information on other modes of transport throughout Cambridgeshire. For example how to get information on bus and rail services and how to obtain a bus pass. It also has a full explanation of the concessionary fare scheme.

The second section lists schemes by district and the type of scheme available. The third and final section lists details of other agencies involved in community transport. It also provides advice on transport for those with mobility difficulties.

A community transport scheme may serve your area and you may be eligible to use it. For instance it can be used to transport you to a medical appointment, or to the nearest post office or shop. The Community Transport Guide 2006 / 2007 is designed to provide you with information in an easy way.

## A message from your local police officers :-

## Register Report and Reunite...

That is the message going out in a new initiative Cambridgeshire Constabulary has joined to encourage people to safeguard their property.

Called "Immobilise" it aims to help reduce mobile phone crime and robbery. Immobilise is a secure database service that allows you to register your mobile phones, lap tops, ipods, sat navs, in-car music systems, cycles (frame numbers) or any other valuables that have a unique serial number.

Registering is free, quick and easy. Once a phone is registered, should the phone be lost or stolen, it can be reported online and the phone immobilised immediately by all service providers. It also enables police officers to search the database for the rightful owner of any recovered property and quickly re-unite them with their property.

Ellen Muirhead, Cambridgeshire Constabulary, comments "The use of this database is an excellent tool in fighting robbery as it takes the value out of anything stolen. We would therefore encourage people to log on to the site and register their property". Other forces using the scheme have significantly reduced the false reporting of theft and street robbery for phones.

The service is supported by amongst others The Home Office, The Mobile Industry Crime Action Forum, The Metropolitan Police, Transport For London, The National Mobile Phone Crime Unit, and almost all the major UK Police forces

Anyone wishing to enter the details of their mobile phone, or other property, onto the database should log on to www.immobilise.com for more information. To find your unique mobile IMEI number just enter \*#06# into the phone and the number will appear.







The Fund supports small voluntary and community groups to improve the lives of children and young people aged 0-19 (up to 25 for young people with learning disabilities).

Groups throughout Cambridgeshire and Peterborough can apply for grants of between £250 and £7,000 to develop projects and activities for children and young people. You will need to give a good reason why the children and young people involved in your activity need particular help.

The Local Network Fund enables local voluntary and community groups working with children and young people to provide opportunities and increased access to activities and facilities.

Last year the Local Network Fund in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough awarded over £360,000 to deserving groups throughout the county. This money went towards a wide range of projects including starting up mother and toddler groups, youth councils and sports projects.

Applications are invited under the five Every Child Matters themes, which are:

- Being Healthy Activities that promote a healthy lifestyle so that children and young people are able to enjoy good health.
- Staying Safe Activities that contribute to children and young people being protected from harm and neglect and growing up able to look after themselves.
- Enjoying and Achieving Activities that help children and young people to maximise their potential and develop skills for adulthood.
- Making a Positive Contribution Activities that enable children and young people to use their own skills and abilities in ways to enhance their own lives and the lives of their communities.
- Achieving Economic Well-being Activities that help children and young people overcome barriers and achieve their full potential.

#### EAST CAMBS DISTRICT COUNCIL NEWS

#### Tax Again

Can I take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy New Year?

The first important task of the Council is to set the budget for the following year's council tax. May I remind readers that ECDC collects tax on behalf of the County Council, the Police, the Fire Brigade and Parish Councils. Only about 10% of your tax goes to East Cambs DC.

This year the Policy and Resource Committee has recommended an increase of 2.5%. We believe this; together with £310,000 of efficiency savings, will enable the Council to meet its ongoing commitments.

Some of the new initiatives recommended are:

- Prevention of fly-tipping
- The management of anti-social behaviour
- Prevention of homelessness
- Management and maintenance of open spaces
- New leisure facilities for the District

These new initiatives will be funded from underspends during the coming financial year together with sums contributed to the Council from Developers through planning agreements. (Section 106)

#### Waste and Minerals Plan

The Strategic Development Committee supports the Core Strategy setting out the strategic vision, objectives and development control policies to guide the future management of Waste and Minerals across the County. The strategy should provide robust environmental protection policies aimed at protecting residents from noise, odour and traffic nuisance.

The Council will only support the development of a state-of-theart Household Waste Recycling Centre at Witchford subject to the protection of local residents and adjoining businesses.

On the other hand, the Council objects to the proposals for an inert waste landfill at Kennet and the proposal at Fordham unless environmental mitigation measures are in place to protect local residents.



February sees the start of Lent, with Shrove Tuesday, Pancake Day on the 20th; (There will be pancake racing at Scotland End once the children have returned from school! Watch a space for more information. Leaflets will appear.) Then the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, on the 21st. Traditionally it is a time to give something up. Chocolate, or alcohol, or sugar in your tea. Something that will make you stop and think about what you do. Which will cause you some difficulty, some minor discomfort. Then you have to keep that going for the whole of Lent, until Easter dawns and you can go back to your old ways.

But life isn't always that simple is it? New Year's resolutions look increasingly impossible after a couple of days, and all those visits to the gym, those diets, that clear out of the cupboards, merge into the business of everyday life and we go on as usual, falling back into our old ways.

Until, that is, something either really appalling, or something truly wonderful comes our way. Some disease strikes, some unexpected tragedy hits you right in the middle of your life. Something new happens. You are caught up in a terrorist outrage. A new child is born. You can add your own happening.

My brother reported that last week, on his way to London on the train, it hit a landslide at 80 mph, and was derailed. The carriages stayed upright, fortunately, and though shaken about, he and his wife were unharmed. It could have been so much worse. A brush with the fragility of life can hit us all from time to time. Creep up on us unawares, and make us think deeply about what life is all about.

Then we have to think again. To assess what we really believe. What we think is truly important in our lives. Where our relationships are taking us, and how much we mean to each other.

We see both extremes all the time. Extreme tragedy on the one hand, and, at the other end of the spectrum, new life and new beginnings. All cause challenge. Challenge to our way of life, for, after both kinds of experience, nothing can be quite the same again.

Lent reminds us of the journey of Jesus Christ to the cross. A path which took him to the extremes of suffering, of a painful and tragic death on that Good Friday, in that lonely city, Jerusalem, all those years ago. But it was not the end. There was, and is, new life. There is hope. We can live in new times. Death is not the end. However hard to understand, and we are all on that journey of discovery, Jesus came to show us that our God cares deeply for us, he loves us with an intensity it is hard to contemplate.

What will you do this Lent? What would make a difference for you?
