

Well a blur of economising, worrying about making ends meet, eating up left over's, trying ever more inventive recipes with cold turkey, holiday brochures flicked through, plans for the year half made, resolutions will also have been thought about, made in the fireworks and euphoria of the new year, abandoned with great alacrity almost straight away, and an uneasy feeling of, "not quite good enough" has crept back into our lives.

Christmas was a time of great excitement; relatives came from near and far, in some cases held up by the coldest weather in a generation which brought our transport systems to a halt and we rediscovered how fragile life can be, and we celebrated with friends and family alike, the Good News for humankind. Our Neighbourhood Panels point the way

With 'Localism' being advocated Neighbourhood Panels in East Cambridgeshire have been setting the agenda and taking **action on** *every* **issue** of concern raised at the meetings, for several years already.

The current economic climate and the outcomes of the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review are posing particular challenges to managers in public service agencies. It is clear that different ways of thinking are needed and agencies will need to participate fully in partnership arrangements, together with local residents.

The Panels discuss local issues (raised at each meeting by residents and Panel members) which are clarified and then acted upon by the agencies working together.

The agendas of the Panel meetings reflect the current major issues with consultation on NHS Services in the Community, an update from the Police Authority and information about budgetary implications.

Each meeting has:

- feedback on actions taken to address the issues of concern and priorities identified at the last Panel meeting;
- involvement of local residents in outlining issues of concern about their locality;
- a focus on action, to address the issues raised, and identify the priorities.

Some of the impacts of the actions include:

- Reduction in fly-tipping;
- Reduction in 'green laning' (4x4s driving along droves/ by-ways)
- Production of action plans to combat dog fouling;
- Reduction in levels of crime;
- Reduction in reported acts of anti-social behaviour
- The introduction of the Speedwatch scheme and a reduction in the numbers of recorded speeding vehicles
