The Snailwell Cup

The Cup Final was held on 5th May at Lakenheath between Littleport Town and West Wratting. Littleport were the winners by 2-1. I would like to thank everyone who bought raffle tickets from me for the Grand Draw. 11 prizes came back to Snailwell. Well done to the winners and commiserations to the rest of us: better luck next time. The total raised from Snailwell was £100 which will be added to the money raised on the day to be donated to charity.

A brief history of the Snailwell Cup

The original solid silver trophy was donated in 1925 by the Revd Powles of Snailwell. It was played for on a knock-out basis by local village teams who were members of the Snailwell & District League. Between 1925 and 1938 the competition gained in popularity with an increasing number of teams taking part. Some of those who played for the Snailwell team, known as the "Salmon Tin Dribblers", were George 'Pigeon' Tombs, Mick Worley, Jack May, George Smythe, George and Charles Drake, Walter Dennis Snr & Jnr, known as Paul and Arthur Dennis. During the Second World War the whereabouts of the trophy was unknown. The trophy came to light again in 1956, found on a bar shelf of the Fox public house in Burwell. In 1958 the competition re-started.

Since then there have been 4 presidents, all connected in some way with the Waddilove family, the current president being the grandson of the original donor.

This year is the 76th anniversary, and it's believed to be the oldest surviving football competition. Many charities benefit from the Cup matches, the main one being St Peter's Church, but also several other local ones. The competition is noted for the long service given by its officials, with Adrian Kidd stepping down in 1989 after 25 years as chairman and competition secretary. Keith Dyble is now in his 31st year as Cup official.

Dear friends.

At the end of April, on April 26th, to be exact, a new phase in ministry took place in this deanery with the launch of the Three Rivers Group. At a service in St. Andrews Isleham all those involved in the ministry of the five parishes of Chippenham, Snailwell, Isleham, Kennett and Fordham were commissioned – and that doesn't just mean the two clergy and two licensed readers who will make up the core of the team. All of the 'people of God' as Bishop John put it, were commissioned as well, because we all have a part to play.

For my part, I am to be the group rector, which simply means that I am, at present, the only full-time stipendiary priest within the group. It probably also means that the buck stops with me! Hopefully, it won't be too long before a group priest is appointed for Chippenham and Snailwell, but until that happens I will do my best to be the first port of call as far as pastoral needs are concerned and to put together a rota of those able to take services on Sundays.

One of the things Bishop John told us at the service in April was that this pattern of ministry, of groups of parishes, still autonomous, but working more closely together under the leadership of one stipendiary priest, is to be the pattern of ministry in due course for the diocese as a whole. We are not the first of these groups, but we are one of the first. Whether or not this new pattern will be successful remains to be seen, but the outcome is largely in our hands. This group will be what we want it to be and it will require a great deal of thought and prayer and conversation to discover what we really want it to be.

At the moment I would hope for four things. Firstly, I hope that people will be open and positive about the future. Secondly, I hope that the parishes in which I don't live will keep me informed about pastoral needs (sick visiting, etc.). Thirdly, I hope to hold a kind of day conference some time in the autumn, facilitated by someone outside the group, for us to get to know each other better, to worship and pray together, and to discover what we might be able to do better together than we can do apart and I would love to see a good representation of all five parishes there. And finally, of course, I would value your prayers.
