

Its Anniversary time. St Margaret's in Chippenham is officially 900 years old this year. The history of Chippenham tells us that the church was built, well started anyway, in 1111, so it's time to celebrate. Its varied history has seen a thatched roof, two major fires, restoration throughout the centuries, celebrated and famous people, as well as the rest of us, baptised, married and buried here and the building stands as a constant and continuing witness to God's love for us all. And that is timeless.

So we are celebrating. The Chippenham Olympics are past us and gone, and what a brilliant day. Thanks to everyone who made it work so well, and involve so many in the village.

And then in early April a concert, to be followed by a further concert on July 2nd in church, an evening of light music and entertainment by the Abbot Consort from Bury St Edmunds, and then on Sunday July 17th we shall celebrate St Margaret's Day, with a festival service in the morning at which our new Bishop of Ely, the Rt Rev'd Stephen Conway, will come and preside in church for us, with a great party afterwards. You'll have to keep an eye out for that latter venue. All the churches in our group will be with us on that day, so we are praying for a grand event to mark this anniversary. important time will soon be on its way, so do join us.

The church is here for all, is supported entirely by voluntary contributions, and tells us of those lasting values of love, joy, peace, justice and mercy, sometimes only fleetingly seen on our world. St Margaret of Antioch, in whose name the church is dedicated, was a favourite of the Knights Hospitallers (founded in the early 11th century) who had an important Preceptory here in Chippenham.

Have your say on the future of Chippenham and Snailwell

Help to produce a 'Vision' for your villages

East Cambridgeshire District Council is looking for your views on how your village/parish should change or improve in the future. What sort of place would you like Chippenham and Snailwell to be? What are your priorities for the villages and the wider parish? For example, do you want more school places, better local facilities, new homes or more employment opportunities?

The District Council wants to work in partnership with local people and the Parish Council to draw up a long-term Vision for both Chippenham and Snailwell. The Visions will set out how Chippenham and Snailwell should develop/improve over the next 20 years. It will look at issues such as:

- •local housing needs
- employment opportunities
- sites for development
- •the quality of the local environment
- •infrastructure and facilities –whether to protect and/or improve

The Visions will be used to guide decisions on future development and planning applications. It will also help ensure that key infrastructure and facilities are retained and enhanced. The Visions will be included in the statutory development plan for the East Cambridgeshire - known as the 'Core Strategy'.

A questionnaire will be available for people's comments from 27th June 2011. The questionnaire can be viewed on the District Council's website at www.eastcambs.gov./core-strategy-review; paper copies can be obtained by phoning the Forward Planning team on 01353 665555. The website will also have questionnaires for other settlements in East Cambridgeshire (which you may fill out), as well as other background documents.

Comments should be returned by 18th July 2011. The District Council is keen to get your views, and have as many people involved as possible. You will help to shape draft Visions for Chippenham and Snailwell which will be published early next year, There will be a further opportunity to make comments and the final Visions should be published in late 2012, and should reflect the needs and priorities of the local communities.

Oil Buying Co-operative for CHIPPENHAM

The beginning of summer may seem an odd time to think of buying heating oil, however we all remember the very high prices and supply shortage during the long cold winter just gone.

There is a growing tendency across Britain to establish oil buying co-operatives. There are different types of co-ops, but they basically work like this;

BASIC IDEA

- Households pool their requirements in order to generate a large order of about 10,000 litres of heating oil.
- This is then offered to a number of suppliers with the order going to the lowest price supplier.
- The oil is delivered soon afterwards, and paid for by the householder directly to the oil company after delivery, but at the agreed group price.

WHY IT WORKS

The heating oil supply company can save lorry fuel and time by delivering a full load to one village on one day. They also save a little internal admin time as they do not have to negotiate with each customer. They can pass on some of this saving to the customers in the Oil Co-operative.

This is also a "green" activity, which will become more important for us all.

SOME PROBLEMS and solutions

- Unclear orders- emails and cards only. If no response assume I have not got your order
- Not everyone needing oil at the same time this scheme works well if people
 use top ups, of the minimum 500 litres. This also spreads the pain of rising
 prices, as no one knows which way the prices will go next!
- Special requirements (e.g. locks on gates) these are recorded on a spread sheet and sent to the oil supplier with their order. If you request they will call you before delivering.

SOME OTHER FACTS

According to other groups the saving can be around 5p per litre, which is £50 per 1,000 litres. This co-op could save us each over £100 each per year!

Updates will appear in each newsletter. This means we will assemble an order every 2 months, just after the newsletter is published

A note will be kept of any special requirements, such as a phone call the day before delivery to arrange access; please let me know if you wish to change these. The minimum delivery is 500 litres; this is a Trading Standards ruling because of the accuracy of lorry gauges. To get the minimum ask for 500 litres; do not ask for a" top up" because you might get a "fill up".

Orders will be collated and placed shortly after the order deadline and deliveries may or may not begin the same week. The price will not be known until the order is placed and the supplier may ring for payment before delivery (failure to reply to this call may put your order in jeopardy) or bill you direct after delivery.

Please be aware that most suppliers now add 2% to the invoice for credit card payment.

Debit cards and cheques attract no surcharge.

For the attention of dog walkers

We are pleased that so many dog walkers use our permissive paths round the allotments and horses fields, which we maintain to a high level, by grass cutting and weed control. However, sadly there are a minority of thoughtless dog walkers who are abusing this by not pick-



ing up the dog poo, thereby making the grass cutting and maintenance of machinery very unpleasant. If you haven't got a poo bag with you please flick it into the hedge or long grass that isn't maintained.

Recently walkers were seen were seen encouraging their dogs into our horses baths to wash them! Please do not let your dogs enter the fields and use the baths to swim or wash them in. It is very wasteful both of water and of our time to continually scrub and refill them. Please, if anyone sees this happening approach these people and explain that this is not on.! We wish people to continue to enjoy the area but please respect the people that pay rent for it and work on it. It would be a shame to close these permissive paths, through our duty to our staff and clients.

Your Village and Parish Council needs YOU!

On 5th May 2011, all new Parish Council's were elected. Snailwell Village Parish Council had only 3 nominations for the recent election which means the village is now at the minimum number of councillors for a quorate Council. Without attendance from all three Councillors meetings will no longer be able to be held at a local level and no decisions can be made. East Cambs District Council will need to be informed if further elections need to take place.

Our Parish Council should contain 7 Parish Councillors and we URGENTLY require additional members to ensure decisions can be made at a village level.

The role of the Parish Council is to be the first tier of local government and represent the views of the local community. Parish Council's are closer to the community and are best placed to identifying, understand and address the needs of that community.

The role of a Parish Councillor is to represent the views of all residents within your parish. As Government policy is to devolve more decision making to local councils this opportunity to make a difference and support village issues is vital.

Choose our Tree!

Sadly we are to lose the large sycamore on the right hand side of the green, one of the most prominent trees that we have in the village of Snailwell. It has developed a number of cavities and ECDC has informed us that it will quickly be in a dangerous state and therefore must be felled. A replacement is suggested from a choice of 4 tree species:-

- **1) Small leaved Lime** (Tilla cordata) eventually a final height of 25 metres. It is wide spreading, has considerable wildlife value attracting insects, especially bees
- **2) Beech** (Facus sylvatica) eventually reaches 35 metres on maturity. Wide spreading with dense shade. Has autumn colour and beech mast which is enjoyed by a wide variety of wildlife
- **3) London Plane** (Platanus x hispanica) grows up to 35 metres on maturity. It has distinctive bark and can be mistaken for Sycamore being of similar size, habit and shape.
- **4) Wild Service** (Sorbus torminalis) grows 25 metres on maturity. Has spectacular autumn colour and produces berries which are good food for birds
