### Chippenhams Big Lunch to celebrate the Jubilee

#### Walking in Chippenham Park

The owners of Chippenham Park Estate have for a number of years allowed the residents of the parishes of Chippenham and Snailwell to walk in the Park in designated areas. This arrangement is entirely private and there is no intention to establish public rights of way across the Park. In light of recently reported incidents elsewhere, where members of the public have been harmed by falling trees or stampeded by cattle, access to the Park will be restricted to those times when cattle are not grazing the Park and there are no inclement weather conditions that may increase the risk of sudden tree failure. The Park may also be closed at times where events are being held in the Hall or Park or tree works or agricultural operations are taking place. The permissive access will continue at other times provided certain conditions are observed but the right is reserved to withdraw this permission at any time.

Signage at the main entrance gates will advise whether the park is open or closed for walking.

When the Permissive paths are open it is on condition that:

- Dogs must be kept on a lead, please pick up after your dog
- Access is taken on foot only; horses, bicycles or motorised vehicles are not permitted
- The lake is out of bounds, no swimming is allowed
- Picnicking is not permitted
- Children must be accompanied at all times
- The permitted access route is through the main gate, through the wooden five bar gate, on the main track, through the next gate and again continuing on the stoned track. The access extends as far as the next locked gate at the bottom of the Park, this is clearly signed.
- Keep well away from the area in front of the house and the marquee


## From the Three Rivers Group Associate Priest Rev'd Kate Peacock Tel - 723690

As I write, the hosepipe ban has brought the rain, the heating remains in the 'on' position and I'm wearing boots with socks, not sandals or pumps, and I've yet to enjoy any asparagus! - So we can celebrate that the English summer has well and truly arrived! And what a summer it will be! I for one am very excited about the Olympics (seems to me it's time for fun and celebrations) and the Jubilee will bring its own sense of community celebrations and thanksgiving to our Monarch and Supreme Head of the Church of England. It is set to be a summer of red, white & blue; and gold, silver, bronze. In our churches this summer we will be celebrating and praying for Her Majesty; as we give thanks for her 60 years as defender of the faith. It is a remarkable achievement, for anyone to be so dedicated and so tireless in their work. As a Diocese and as a parish we have all signed and sent a 'Great Big Thank You' card to the Queen, as a sign of our gratitude. Her role as defender of the faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England is as you can perhaps imagine a huge task and a real responsibility – also as head of the Church it does rather make you wonder why all the fuss about Women Bishops; but I suspect that debate is for another time! In our parish we are also celebrating a record 35 weddings this year! (in some churches several on one day - any brides reading this please don't be late!) In each marriage service we pray that the couple's love may be a 'seal upon their hearts and a crown upon their heads' (indeed in the Orthodox Churches Brides and Grooms do wear crowns). #### **VERGES AND VEHICLE ACCESS**

There has been a number of incidents in the village where vehicles have been parked on or driven over the grass verges or pavements. This is often where extra access is required and there is no drop kerb.

Snailwell Parish Council would like to remind all residents that a vehicle is not allowed to drive over a verge and may only be driven over a pavement or footpath if it is entering or leaving a property.

If access is required onto a property, a right of access via a vehicle crossing is required and can be obtained from Cambridge County Council Highways Dept. If an application is successful a dropped kerb should be provided. The pavement needs to be reinforced and any section of verge that has not been covered needs to be replaced.

#### "SHAPE YOUR PLACE"

East Cambridge District Council is always looking to increase community involvement through such initiatives as the Neighbourhood Panel which is held in Soham each quarter. This gives everyone the opportunity to keep up to date with developments that affect us and have a say in district and local issues. #### **VILLAGE TREES**

Having lost another red chestnut tree to disease on the lower green, we are looking for a replacement tree to maintain the street scene.

Unfortunately grants for the replacement trees are no longer available and the cost of a new tree would have to come out of the parish funds.

A resident has recently kindly donated a tree in memory of their mother. Any donations in this or for any other cause are always gratefully accepted and it is always nice to see a tree grow with a purpose.

The parish council would be very interested to hear from any resident of Snailwell who would like to donate a tree in this way.

#### DROUGHT CONDITIONS

It had to happen, as soon as the hosepipe ban started, it hasn't stopped raining!!

Despite this the Environmental Agency warned us that there may be reductions or at worst interruptions in the pumping of water into the village pond if there is no improvement in the water levels or if the drought conditions get worse.

Currently they pump water daily from the pumping station near the A14 flyover on the Snailwell Road into the village pond to maintain water level. Let's hope that the rain we are having will be sufficient to allow them to continue filling the pond.



#### CHIPPENHAM OIL CO-OP FIRST YEAR REVIEW

We have just completed the first annual cycle of 6 bimonthly bulk orders. Here are some interesting facts:

- I. We have bought nearly 80,000 litres of oil
- 2. There are 53 addresses, including the Church and the Village Hall, most of which order regularly
- 3. We made a typical saving of just under 3p per Litre, or £42 on average each.
- 4. I now call 7 different suppliers each time, prices vary hugely, so it is worth phoning round
- 5. This graph shows the variability of the prices:



August seems to be the cheapest month, as many are away on holiday apparently, and so demand is lowest.

In February, despite having our biggest volume order, the saving was very small; however there was a cold snap then which caused a spike in demand.

I am happy to continue the administration of this co-op. I am not going to make any admin charge, as some others do, but I do propose giving a "tithe" of the savings that I have made to the Church restoration fund. If we all did that it would raise £220.

- The minimum delivery is 500 litres; this is a Trading Standards ruling because of the accuracy of lorry gauges. To get the minimum ask for 500 litres; do not ask for a" top up" because you might get a "fill up".
- Orders will be collated and placed shortly after the order deadline and deliveries may or may not begin the same week. The price will not be known until the order is placed and the supplier may ring for payment before delivery (failure to reply to this call may put your order in jeopardy) or bill you direct after delivery.
- Please be aware that most suppliers now add 2% to the invoice for credit card payment. Debit cards and cheques attract no surcharge.
