### **Neighbourhood Panel Report to Chippenham Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting, 7th May 2013**

Chippenham has participated at all meetings of the Soham & East Area Neighbourhood Panel. The Panel is attended by representatives from local Parish Councils, Soham Town, ECDC & CC councillors and council officers, and the Rector of the 3 Rivers Churches. Meetings are open to the public and proceedings are published on the local government website and by newsletter.

This year has seen a considerable reduction in attendance of parish representatives and members of the public, also funding for Panel administration and meetings has been reviewed by the County and future finance withdrawn.

Officers from the District Council report at the meetings on action taken to remedy issues identified at the previous Panel, and presentations are given regarding specific community matters. Most important, this is the only regular meeting with the Area Policing Team currently available to Parish Councils, where reports are given and Neighbourhood Police targets for the next 3 months are proposed.

It has not been decided yet whether the Panel forum will continue in its current form. *Jennifer Wilson*

## Report from the Chairman

**The PC has met eight times since our last annual meeting, as well as a few planning meetings. A number of matters have been dealt with:**

### Palace Lane houses:

The Parish Council own two properties in the village. Both are rented out. The long-standing tenant in 10 Palace Lane moved out at the end of March and the Parish Council has been busy getting the property ready for the new incoming tenant who moved in at the beginning of May. The Parish Council has also spent money during the year on fitting new smoke alarms and replacement of sealed double-glazing units.

### Recycling

The Parish Council has been informed of a new scheme to handle recyclable waste, which will be brought in in 2014. The existing brown bags will be replaced by wheelie bins. The initiative is to help improve the recycling rates for the district.

### Innovations

Village Information Board. The Parish Council is working on providing an information board/map within the village which will highlight footpaths and special points of interest within Chippenham.



## **Play areas**

A group of residents have formed a working party, and are now looking at ways of developing the Over 12's play area near the allotments.

Regular maintenance has been carried out to maintain the high standard of the Under 12's play area. New bark chippings have recently been delivered to improve the safety surface.

## **Newsletter**

The printed circulation of the newsletter has been restricted to Chippenham only as Snailwell were unable to contribute towards the print cost.

## **Financial Support**

The Parish Council provided financial support for the following: Church grass cutting, Jubilee, Firework display, Over 60s bonus Christmas play

## **Neighbourhood Panel:**

The PC has continued to support and take an active part in this initiative. A representative from the PC has attended every meeting.

## VILLAGE HALL REPORT 2013

AGM was held on April 16th 2013. The same officers were voted in and the committee was elected as before by acclamation.

- Chris Mason the treasurer reported the funds balance was £5,604 marginally up on last year, possibly due to the fact the urinals flush time has been decreased and therefore has made a marked saving on the water bill!
- The main hall needs redecorating and some quotes are being sourced.
- The sound limiter has been installed and will be calibrated soon.
- It was noted that Councillor Allan has stated the recycling bins will remain in the car park even when the new recycling system is up and running.
- The PC was thanked for the donation towards new chairs and it was agreed the old chairs should be sold to raise funds. It was suggested the new chairs should be a different colour (blue?) to help prevent incorrect stacking with the old ones.
- The committee decided to consider new ideas for fund raising, possibly a table top sale in Sept/Oct and the Chippenham Challenge in Feb 2014 to include cheese & wine.
- Sadly Pat Ship is giving up cleaning the hall so we are looking for a new cleaner.

Pat was thanked for all the hard work she has done for the hall.

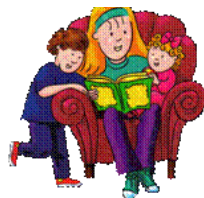

It may seem that things have gone a bit quiet since 8 March when we signed contract with BT for the comprehensive and Peterborough. The Connecting Cambridgeshire team is working closely with BT to ensure the roll-out of better broadband is delivered swiftly and effectively to make the best use of the public investment.

For BT Openreach, this means drawing up schedules and carrying out surveys to re-design the core network and expand the reach of fibre broadband across the county. This is a large-scale project which will involve upgrading over 100 telephone exchanges and installing many more new cabinets across the county. Alongside this, the team has started working with county and district planning and highways teams to make the process for rolling out better broadband as smooth and efficient as possible.

### The roll-out

Following careful planning the roll-out will start as soon as possible and is due to be completed by the end of 2015.

We are not able to provide detailed timing and areas of roll-out at this stage, however you can be assured that over the life of the programme it will reach every community in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough that currently lacks access to broadband services. Parish annual meetings

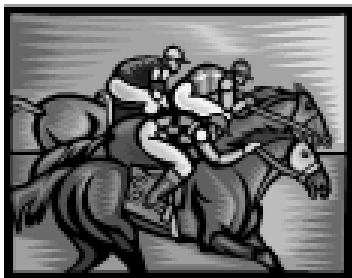

Jewellery recovered in field

# News about The Tharp Arms

In February it became known that Mark and Ali, who had run the pub for 8 years were ending their tenancy at the end of April. In this difficult market, it was not certain that another suitable tenant would be found.

A meeting of concerned villagers took place on the 12th in the Pub. About thirty people and the chairman of the PC, James Broad, took part in a complex discussion. Establishing a steering committee to look into the possibility of a community tenancy, to ensure that the pub stayed open. An amount of about £30,000 would need to be raised to invest in this option.

The Steering committee prepared a questionnaire, aimed at identifying possible investors, volunteers and supporters. It also aimed to establish the importance of the pub to villagers and what other services they thought a new management could deliver.

In March Greene King confirmed the decision to sell the pub, and subsequently Ali agreed to stay on as a manager until July. The steering committee continued with its survey, and presented the results to a village meeting on 26th April with about 20 people present. James Hurst explained the pub land and outbuilding are being offered for sale with a guide price of £285,000 plus vat. A buyer would thus need about £400,000 in cash, including working capital. The sale does not include the field at the centre of the village behind the pub.

Cathy Brown and Mark Connelly presented the findings from the survey that they had designed and summarised. There were 80 responses, 27 of whom indicated that they would be prepared to invest some money in a community scheme. Most responses showed people prepared to volunteer in some way. Only two responses said that they did not care if the pub closed. Some good ideas for new services were also identified. Keith Lomas chaired a discussion with everyone involved to identify next steps if any. In a nutshell, the sum of £400,000 to buy the pub is a serious investment compared with the tenancy sum of £30,000. The meeting identified that no one present wanted to establish a community pub company to find the £400,000, and most importantly manage or appoint a manager to run it. Some attendees stated that they would be willing to support a 'lead investor' if one comes forward. Generally the asking price is felt to be too high, and people want to wait and see what happens.

The steering committee will pass on the survey to the new owner, and publish the results on the village website. I would like to thank all of the above, who gave a lot of time out of their busy lives to conduct the survey.
