SUMMER IN THE GARDEN WITH SALLIE

Hi, I'm Sallie! I run a small horticultural business supplying farm shops & florists in East Anglia, and I am lucky to be based at your great local farm shop, La Hogue. This is mainly a general feature, but if there is any topic you would like covered please just let me know: sallie@riverbanknursery.com.

It's now time to get busy in your garden putting out all your summer plants:

- Make sure you include long-life feed granules in your pots and baskets, plants get very hungry over the summer. If you have already planted up, you can use a liquid feed weekly. Have fun experimenting with bold colour choices!
 - Turn your hanging baskets regularly so all the plants get good sunlight.

 This will prolong the growing season.
- Remember to 'dead head' (removing faded or dead flowers from plants); it continues the flowering season and is a relaxing activity with a cuppa after work.
- Continue to cut herbs regularly, even if you are not using them, as it encourages fresh new growth. You can freeze or dry any excess herbs, or pop some in your bin as a natural freshener. Mint is lovely frozen in ice cubes for summer drinks!
- Keep an eye out for pests in your veg patch, especially slugs on your salad leaves. Sow salad crops every three weeks; this avoids a glut with a steady supply.
- You can grow most veg in containers, even courgettes! This veg will happily climb up
 a trellis or wall, just tie them (and all container-grown veg) in as they grow.

 It's so nice to be able to pop outside and pick your own fresh veg!

 And it's an easy way to start if you are new to gardening or short on time.
 - Stake any tall perennials, such as Delphiniums, in your borders to stop wind damage.
 - Don't forget to water and enjoy your garden!

District Council Report

Cllr Schumann reported that the District Council had approved a budget which meant no increase in their portion of the council tax. Recycling statistics are up by 60% compared to before the wheelie bins were introduced.

County Council Report

The council approved a budget which includes a 2% rise. Some of the budget-cut proposals have been removed, for this year at least.

Planning

Interior modifications. There were no comments or objections.

Matters Arising

A. Play Areas – U12 - The council has now received a quote of £733.73 from FLP to replace the rotten beams (3) at the play area and tighten the zip wire. The council has received a donation of £300 from Waitrose towards playground maintenance. The council voted to pay for these repairs and use the £300 donation towards the cost. The Clerk will place the order. B. Play Areas – Phase 3 - The PDC equipment has now been modified so that the handles do not bounce up when the user sits on or gets off of the equipment. The council is satisfied with this fix. The air-skier still has plenty of play in the bearings. The council will ask Richard to feed back their findings to Fresh Air Fitness.

<u>C. Lights</u> - The Clerk has been given a list of column numbers, but needs clarification on whether these all need modification and whether any others need work. Cllr Schumann will re-visit the light in the Vicarage garden issue as highlighted several months ago.

<u>D. Village Hall</u> - NB had received two quotes for re-surfacing of the car park. The first one, which is for block paving, was £18000. The second for Tarmac was £16000. Neither option is affordable to the council.

 $\underline{\mathsf{E. Grants}}$ - The Clerk will re-circulate the proposed draft policy, ready for adoption at the next meeting unless there are any further modifications.

 $\underline{\mathsf{F. Grass Verge}} - \underline{\mathsf{Isleham Road}}$ - The Clerk has chased the Highways Department for a response on this issue.

<u>G. Allotment Footpath</u> - Carter Jonas has contacted the Clerk regarding the plan to repair the track. The Clerk has forwarded the plan to all councillors and given feedback to CJ in relation to their plan.

Highway Matters

LHI bid: The council's bid for funding for traffic calming measures from the Local Highway Improvement fund was unsuccessful.

Village Matters

<u>A. Risk Assessment</u> - The Clerk reported that the asphalt on the corner of Palace Lane and High Street is raised and therefore a trip hazard. The tree roots from the along the path to the church are coming through the asphalt again. She will report this to the Highways Dept. <u>B. Grass cutting</u> - Packhorse Fencing has quoted the same rate as last year. Because of the number of cuts needed, the cost of cutting in 2015 was more than previous years. Therefore, for 2016 the council will authorise six cuts, any more will need to be agreed by the council.

Correspondence and Financial Matters

<u>A. Policies</u> - It was agreed that in order to bring the council in line with best practice, a number of policies should be created and adopted. NP has been researching other councils' good practice and has a list of policies which need review. The council agreed to share out this work in order to prevent it becoming onerous for one person.

<u>B. Financial Software package</u> - The Clerk had looked into using a dedicated financial software package for the council's accounts. Two packages had been recommended; RBS Alpha and Scribe 2000.

<u>D. Village Hall</u> - The sound limiter has been re-set. New shutters will be installed next week, which means the hall will be unavailable for two days.

<u>E. Grants</u> - The Clerk had amended the Grants Policy based on feedback from the council and re-circulated it for approval. The council has now formally adopted this policy.

<u>F. Emergency Plan</u> - WP circulated a draft copy of a revised emergency plan that she had put together. She asked for input from the council to identify any risks not listed and also people

(<u>F. continued:</u>) with skills or facilities which could be called upon in the event of an emergency.

<u>G. Grass Verge – Isleham Road</u> - The Clerk is meeting with Neil Band of the Highways Dept on 12 April to discuss various outstanding issues in the village.

<u>H. Allotment Footpath</u> - No update; The Clerk will ask Carter Jonas for an update on this matter.

Correspondence and Financial Matters

<u>A. Policies – General</u> - Members of the council have volunteered to review procedures and policies with a view of personalising them for Chippenham Parish Council. There is a deadline of two weeks before the June meeting for these to be completed and circulated to the council for review.

<u>B. Financial Software package</u> - The Clerk has sought recommendations on the two software packages that are being considered. The RBS Alpha system is preferred for the level of support and training that comes with it. This item will be discussed again at the June meeting.

<u>C. Audit – appointment of internal auditor and scope of audit</u> - It was agreed to appoint Judy Broadway as the auditor for the internal audit. FM and SH will draft a Terms of Reference document.

<u>D. Annual meeting date</u> - As discussed at the March meeting, the date for the annual meetings is 16 May.

<u>E. Newsletter – minutes</u> - The meeting discussed whether the summary of minutes which was produced by the Clerk before the full minutes were published on the website should be re-instated in the newsletter so that those residents without access to the internet could still have access to the information. The Clerk will publish the summary from April onwards.
