

The anniversary of 9/11 passed in a reflective and thoughtful mood, giving us all time to think through the meaning and how we should live our lives.

An exploding wheel on an agricultural lorry caused consternation in Chippenham, but no one was hurt, and was this really the high spot of a quiet afternoon in the country? But that's an illusion, isn't it? The recent violence and looting on our streets seem to be very far away from the apparent tranquillity of our rural idyll.

I will keep a note of any special requirements, such as access requirements; please let me know if you wish to change these. The minimum delivery is 500 litres; this is a Trading Standards ruling because of the accuracy of lorry gauges. To get the minimum ask for 500 litres; do not ask for a" top up" because you might get a "fill up".

Orders will be collated and placed shortly after the order deadline and deliveries may or may not begin the same week. The price will not be known until the order is placed and the supplier may ring for payment before delivery (failure to reply to this call may put your order in jeopardy) or bill you direct after delivery.

Please be aware that most suppliers now add 2% to the invoice for credit card payment. Debit cards and cheques attract no surcharge.

Thank you to the 12 people who joined up to buy 10,000 litres in August. We saved £36 each on a 1,000 litre fill. Let's see how we go this time!

eighbourhood Panels work in your area on what you would like to see improved and will make your locality a better place to live. The last Soham and East area Neighbourhood Panel meeting on Wednesday 29th June and reported on how we have

been addressed your issues of concern:

 Anti-social behaviour (ASB) at Barleyfields Estate, Soham, the seizure of alcohol from young persons, confiscation of tobacco from a juvenile, a S27 Dispersal Notice for an intoxicated male.

The outcome was that anti-social behaviour has reduced and the residents felt that things had improved. In addition we reviewed Parking and driving offences across the Panel area

- 142 penalty tickets had been issued in this quarter
- a S59 warning was given to a driver who was wheel spinning,
- a vehicle was seized for not having insurance cover.

The issue of securing road safety improvements to minor roads, especially reductions in speed limits, has been raised at many Panel meetings across the District. The County Council has revised its speed limit policy; under the new policy, where the county council is unable to respond to a request for a change in speed limit in a settlement, because it does not meet the criteria, local communities will be able to decide on the setting of speed limits in their settlements, provided that they are willing to cover the costs involved. Recent crime trends have included thefts from sheds, garages and allotments in the villages – here are a few ideas to protect your own and your communities property

- •Ensure Sheds are of a strong structure and in good repair. Contact alarms are easily available through various websites which are cost effective.
- •If the allotment is to be left unattended for some time eg winter months, remove tools all together.
- •Mark your property with your postcode and house number (punching kits are available from hardware stores.) Or even permanent marker pen.
- •Register your property on Immobilise, this is a free property registering system used nationwide by Police forces, visit www.immobilsise.com door and window stickers are also available indicating that the property is registered and traceable.
- •Personalising tools with paint will make them less appealing to thieves.
- •Consider a locking device that links tools together with a strong chain threaded through the handles and locked to the wall or floor.
- •Consider joint funding a perimeter fence for the allotment site.
