There is a story about a young boy who was out collecting money for a charity to feed the hungry. He was selling postcards at 10p each, and called at a house. The person at the door asked how much he was aiming to raise? "I am raising a million pounds," the boy answered gravely. He was so small and the the sum he named so large that the person at the door had to laugh. "One million pounds indeed. Do you expect to raise it all yourself?" "Oh no", the boy replied, "there's another little boy helping me!"

Listening to, and watching the news can be very challenging, especially at present it seems. Descriptions of barbarous actions to hostages in the Middle East are horrifying. I wrote elsewhere in August and September and underestimated by a factor of ten the number of those killed in Gaza. I won't comment on the Scottish referendum, because by the time you read this the result will have been published and speculation may either be 100% accurate or the alternative! I am sure there will be some strong views about all these issues in many parts of our communities.

Well, Martin Luther King gave us some helpful advice: "I have decided to stick with love," he said. "Hate is too great a burden to bear." To follow my thoughts from last month about peace starting within us, in our own hearts, and then spreading to our families and our communities and beyond may seem like a counsel too difficult to hear. But Jesus teaches us that love really is at the centre of the universe, for God is love, and all the apparently "normal" rules actually fly out of the window once you are "in love". God yearns for us to be in fellowship with him, to love first of all God, and then ourselves and then others too. It's a mighty powerful foundational rule for all our lives. Let's try and live it out.

# Summary of Minutes from the last PARISH COUNCIL meeting held on 5th August Full minutes are available from the Clerk

#### I. Play Areas

#### i.Youth Park Project

Mr Cross will provide a plan for staggered gates for the allotment path which will be sent to the diocese for approval. Mrs Hughes has booked the annual RoSPA inspection for both playgrounds. Inspections will be carried out in September.

#### ii. New Street Play Area Lease

The paperwork has now been sent off to the land registry for registration.

#### 2. Village Information Board

Work is progressing on the production of the village map.

#### 3. Police Information

There has been one reported incident; logged as a malicious letter, it was a complaint about comments on Facebook.

#### 4. Planning

None

#### 5. Highway Matters

#### i. Parkside Corner

Work has now been completed at Parkside to improve drainage. The Highways Dept has installed a new soakaway, cleared out the existing soakaways and repaired the kerb.

#### ii. Local Highways Grant

The meeting discussed traffic calming in the High Street and the new road layout in Fordham. There were mixed opinions on the benefits of such a scheme in Chippenham. The council voted to apply for pavement repairs in the High Street from

#### i. Risk Assessment

The meeting discussed heavy tree limbs but acknowledged that little could be done unless one was identified as being dangerous.

#### ii. Tharp Arms - Bus Shelter

The PC voted to progress with the transfer of the ownership of the bus shelter from the pub to the Parish Council.

#### iii.Village Hall

Mrs Parsons is getting quotes for the various works which need to be carried out at the hall. Mrs Parsons is working on a risk assessment for the hall.

#### iv. Dog Fouling

The upcoming project to highlight the problem of dog fouling was discussed. It was mentioned that Fordham PC has invested in CCTV for their recreation ground. After discussion it was decided that Chippenham does not need this level of policing.

#### v. Village Gates

The white gate which was splashed with wood stain will be re-painted.

#### 7. Correspondence and Financial Matters

#### i. Newsletter

Mrs Cross has resigned as editor of the Newsletter. Mrs Maxwell has offered to edit the Newsletter in the short term until a new editor is in place.

#### ii. PC Noticeboard

The council approved the idea of a new noticeboard for the village hall specifically for PC business.

We still have eight horses so you will still be able to see them in their fields, some are retired and some will be working for Becky. She will be keeping her Facebook page 'Bambi Coach House' with all the latest happenings.

#### STOP MESSING ABOUT!

Thank you for supporting the 'Stop messing about!' campaign to help rid the village of dog mess. Over a period of a month people walking around the village will have seen the scale of the problem, there were lots of yellow 'poo markers' sign-posting dog poo which had not been cleared up. In fact, when the month long campaign finished the horse paddock pathways alone had over 50 markers. That's a lot of unpleasant dog mess!

The hope is that dog walkers who previously neglected to clear up after their dogs understand the message from other people who use the public spaces: 'Bag it, Bin it and keep Chippenham clean.' The section of pathway alongside the allotments was the worst affected area with new poo markers added throughout the campaign period. However a noteworthy improvement was seen in the cricket club areas. It would be great if this was sustained and a similar improvement was also seen in the other footpaths and public areas.

The next newsletter will have further comments on the dog mess problem. So dog walkers please take poo-bags with you on your walks, keep an eye on your dog all the time you are walking and 'Bag it, Bin it and keep Chippenham clean.'

To help reduce the problem at the allotment entrance the Parish Council will be replacing the existing bin with a larger capacity one in order to deter the pile up of poo bags on and around the bin.

The existing bin can be re-located elsewhere in the village so if there is an area where you think a bin would be beneficial (it needs to be accessible by vehicle) then please let the Clerk know. The Parish Council would welcome any further comments on this topic. Thank you.

As the season comes to a close we can say that 2014 has been yet another successful year for the club.

For adults we have run two Saturday sides, a Sunday side, a midweek evening side and a midweek afternoon side.

Regarding the 1st X1 - after a very ordinary start to life in the Cambridgeshire Senior League .....4 losses in the first 5 matches, the 1st XI have had an amazing turnaround winning promotion to the 2nd Division of the Senior League. This is the 5th promotion in a row the team has enjoyed. A measure of the team's progress is that we will be playing towns and cities next year such as Ely and Wisbech...... quite an achievement for a village of 350 people!

The 2nd XI had a very mixed season with some very good wins, some narrow losses and a number of games conceded by the opposition. The team was very ably led by Ashley Brown; having finished mid-table, they are optimistic for next season.

Our midweek team also won their league and cup final – next season will be a good challenge in the higher league – but we do have the players and captain (Paul Fishpool) to succeed!

We have had a very healthy Junior section, catering for children aged 7 years and upwards, throughout the season. Coaching has taken place on a Monday night during the summer and cricket camps have also been held at the ground during the holidays. We also have Junior teams playing in the Suffolk Junior League.

Our Friendly XIs, playing on Sunday and midweek have had a great season with a number of memorable games – the spirit of village cricket, with the declaration format, certainly lives on with our two captains Alan Wright and Darren Hughes.

The ground has been in magnificent condition thanks to Alan Wright and his band of helpers. Despite the wet weather at times no league fixtures at home have been called off at all.
