Parish Council Update

Since our last update the council chairman Cllr Nick Bennett has met with the Police and Crime Commissioner Darryl Preston. They walked around Chippenham and discussed the issues of speeding and rural crime. Cllr Bennett has requested that there is more police presence in Chippenham and suggested that the police vary their routine journeys so that they drive via Chippenham on occasion. This request will be fed back to Ely Police.

The council has been successful in securing a Pride of Place grant from East Cambs District Council. This money will be used to improve the wildflower areas in the Under 12s play area. New seasonal spring bulbs will be bought and planted, the old tulips from the planters will be used in the area and drought tolerant wildflower seed will be sown for some summer colour and to create a natural habitat and food source for insects. The grant will also fund a new tree for the area which will be planted to replace one that had to be removed last year.

The parish council had arranged for the surface of the spiral slide to be refinished. This work is now complete and we are told that the ride down the slide is now a much more pleasant, and faster, experience. Just in time for half term too!

Thank you for the volunteers who came out on Saturday 14th October to help us plant 800 bulbs in the verges along the High Street and at the top of Tharp Way. We look forward to seeing the new flowers in the spring.

The council has been in discussion with the diocese to request for the allotment hedge to be cut to improve the look of the street scene and ensure that there is good visibility for residents when crossing the road between the two footpaths. The work has now been carried out and the hedge is looking much tidier.

The council has been asked to provide feedback to Cambridgeshire County Council regarding their Highways Service. Our feedback focussed on providing prompt responses to issues raised such as potholes, broken signs etc. and the lack of communication from CCC. We hope that this feedback will help to improve their service.

The council is considering undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. This is a major project which would provide some protection to the community against speculative development. However, the decision on if to take this forward will depend on whether there is sufficient buy-in from the community and enough volunteers willing to get involved in shaping the plan. St Margaret's Church

I wonder whether you are expecting to have an Advent Calendar this year? For many people, especially children, the countdown to Christmas can seem very long, and an Advent calendar helps to make the waiting more bearable.

When I was young, an Advent calendar was a cardboard picture with little flaps which opened to reveal ... little pictures. That kind is still about, but nowadays Advent calendars are far, far more. There are ones with a small chocolate behind each number, or a big chocolate, or Lego, or beer, or Gin & Tonic, or ... almost anything.

The Body Shop Box of Wishes and Wonders, is filled with skincare and beauty products, and it's a snip at £145 – at least compared to the Dior version for £3,400!

There are calendars based on books, films, TV series, and games, and some decidedly eye-opening ones! I couldn't decide whether the most niche one was beard oils, or Raspberry Pi computer components.

Some places have trouble deciding whether they want to help us with the waiting for Christmas, or just want to part us from our money: Melt Chocolate has a "12 Days of Christmas Chocolate Advent Calendar" which is very confusing because the 12 days of Christmas only begin once Advent has finished. And Maison Francis Kurkdjian turns the whole idea on its head with its "After Calendar" designed to run from Christmas to New Year – if you have £950 to spend.

Back with the more normal sort of Advent calendar, it's nice to have a bit of Christmas now, even though we know it's not yet here, and that mixture of "now and not yet" has a lot in common with the Christian faith. Every Advent we wait for Christmas when we celebrate Jesus being born, because it's "not yet". At the same time we know that Jesus was born 2000 years ago, so he is here "now" as well.

Jesus himself taught his followers that "the Kingdom of God has come" – it is Now, but it's hard to see the evidence of that because it's Not Yet fully realised. The anticipation of Advent and the joy of Christmas are a picture for us of that Kingdom as we wait for it.

If you haven't sorted out your Advent calendar yet, why not do an online search for "charity advent calendar"? There are plenty of options to enjoy while you wait for Not Yet of Advent to become the Now of Christmas, and do other people good at the same time.

His long career in teaching helped many to develop and flourish. During his working life and in retirement, his desire to volunteer was one of his many virtues. Therefore, setting up a fund in his name aimed at supporting others to do the same thing seemed an appropriate way of remembering him.

The fund is not necessarily just available to use for cricket related activities and the Fund's committee welcomes applications for funding from the wider community.

Applications for funding of between £50 and £300 are welcome.

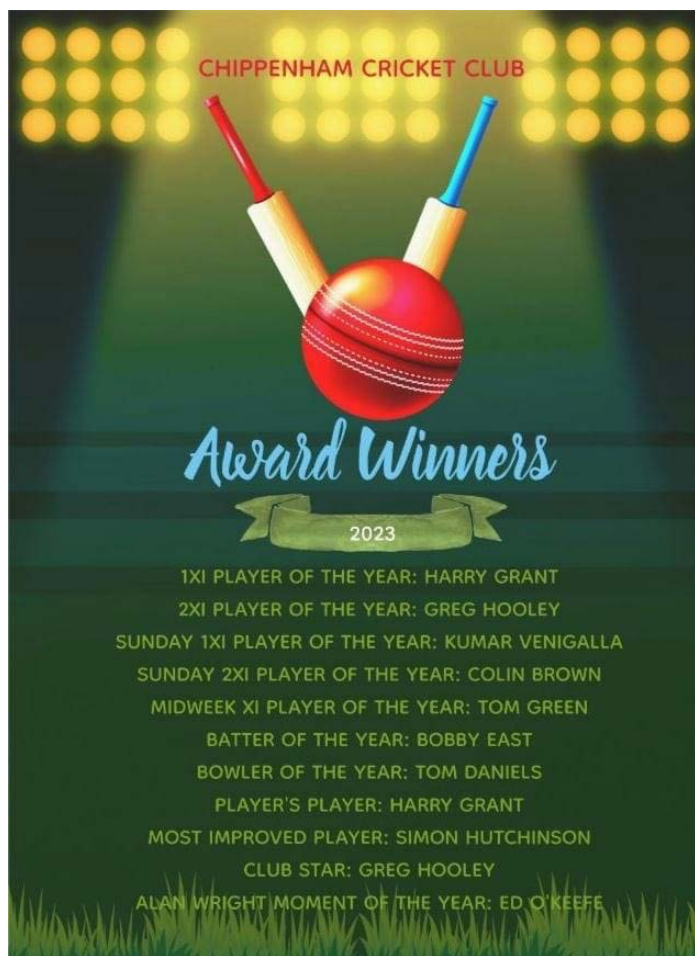

Chippenham 'Seniors' Lunches

What are they?

These lunch events are open to any current, or former, Chippenham resident who has reached a 'certain age' (65 or thereabouts!). There are, currently, around 30 of us, which includes helpers and organisers as well as regular, or occasional, lunchgoers. No regular commitment required – just come as you please.

For £7.50 a head, all enjoy a convivial, hearty 2 course meal in the village hall or, on occasion, a local restaurant or pub where we try to keep the cost below £12 for a 2-course meal.

We have an annual Christmas lunch, for which there is no charge.

When and where do they happen?

It varies, and we haven't met for a while, but we aim to meet every 6-8 weeks, or so, on a weekday. For every 1-2 meals in the village hall, we go out to a local restaurant or pub (the carvery at the Heathcourt Hotel has been a popular destination). Tuesdays have generally worked best – but the lunch organisers (or co-ordinating 'committee') is open to any suggestions, as Tuesdays, or some venues, do not suit everyone all the time.

How do I get there?

Transport is organised among the participants and can be co-ordinated by the committee (generally a car-share arrangement).

A Candle for All Souls' Day

St Margaret's Church, Chippenham

For the past few years, a tealight has been posted to the households in Chippenham in readiness for All Souls Day

All Souls' Day

All Souls' Day, on the 2nd of November, also known as the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, is a day dedicated to prayer and remembrance for the souls of those who are no longer with us.

Bringing light into the darkness

Lighting a candle can be a strong symbol of our commitment to remember someone after their death, as well as an aid to contemplation.

Sung Compline

This is a short (20 minutes) service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. St Margaret's choir will sing the service to plainchant (similar to Gregorian chant), by candlelight, and the congregation is invited to rest and be refreshed by the prayer, music and space.
