District Council Report

JH – told the meeting about her involvement with Dementia Friends as part of her role as ECDC's representative for Health and Wellbeing. Fordham will be holding their first meeting on 7th October. JH is encouraging other villages to set up their own groups.

County Council Report

No update.

Planning

i.19/01047/LBC – **50 High Street, aircon unit** – this application has already been approved.

ii.19/00331/OUM – 10 dwellings land off Scotland End, additional information.

The council had no further comments over and above those already submitted. FM has volunteered to attend the planning panel meeting. JH recommended that the data from the speed sign be submitted to planning so that Highways can review it.

iii.**Sunnica Solar Farm** No further updates. Lawrence is trying to arrange a meeting for the parish council group.

JH has spoken to Lucy Frazer MP and expressed the general concern that the scheme is too big. JH will ask LF to attend an open meeting in Chippenham to hear the local concerns.

The PC will put an article in the next newsletter to inform the village about the council's position on the Sunnica development.

The council would like to know ECDC's position on the development? JH will update from them.

Vote: the council voted unanimously to oppose the Sunnica development in its current format.

iv. 19/01243/FUL – **45 High Street,** rear extension No objections

Play areas

i.Swing repair

Both swing seats are cracked and have been identified as possible risk factors due to skin nipping. NB has obtained a quote from FLP £83.40 for supply only for both swings. KP to fit. NB to inspect after work complete.

Highway Matters

i. Traffic Working Group

NB – the speed sign is now in New Street. The next location will be back near the school house.

ii.Park Farm Corner

Traffic calming measures (chevrons, white lining and signs) have been installed. SH will ask for the sharp bend sign to be re-installed.

District Council Report

JH is continuing her work to create Dementia friendly communities. YH from Chippenham is interested in getting involved for Chippenham.

County Council Report

LHI panel will meet in January 2020 and a decision should be made in Feb 2020. Flytipping prosecutions are happening. The parish council thought that more publicity about these prosecutions would help to deter would-be fly tippers.

Planning

- i. **Sunnica** There was some confusion around the role of ECDC in regards to Sunnica. ECDC will not form or publish their position until after the statutory consultation period. The council voted to issue a questionnaire to all villagers, based on a template from Freckenham. All responses will be anonymous. NB will take action on this and several members of the council have offered to help distribute the questionnaires.
- ii. 19/01374/VAR Chippenham Park- vary time period no objections.
- iii. Old Mill Stud new house and alterations to existing property no objections

Play areas

- i. Swing Repair Swing seats have been replaced.
- ii. Crossing near play areas It was discussed that the hedge should be cut back at the allotments to improve visibility.

Highway Matters

i. Traffic Working Group

The speed sign is now back in the High Street, opposite the church. PF said that the traffic approaching from Fordham is problematic and that the sign had a positive impact when it was located outside the village hall. NB will be moving the sign further up the High Street and then back to the village hall.

ii. Park Farm Corner

Highways has responded to the request to reinstate the 'sharp bend' sign to say that the scheme of work is complete and that they will not be installing another sign.

Village Matters

i. Risk Assessment

Pavement trip hazards reported – New Street and High Street

PF reported that the white lines on the road at the La Hogue bend have worn away. The clerk will report this issue to Highways.

ii. Noticeboards

NB has assessed the work needed to restore the noticeboards in the bus shelter and estimates it will cost around £100 in materials. He has offered to do the work himself. The council has chosen to use cork backed boards rather than magnetic.

v. Village Sign

JB has told the clerk that work is progressing on the sign and that he will come along to a meeting in the near future to update the council in more detail.






Depending on when you pick this up to read we are in the run up to an election or in the post election calm/chaos. Oh no not more about politics! I hear you groan. One of the things I'm always interested in at election time are what are the things which we think are important? When deciding which candidate to put your cross against, or deciding not to bother at all, what are the major factors? Do we vote for the party we've always voted for, that our family have always voted for? Will it be about what the party thinks about the dreaded B word? Is it because of a philospical commitment to the free market or socialism? To what extent is it a popularity contest based on the party leader, or dislike of the opposing party leader.

I suppose the parallel thing I'm interested in is how people think about God and the church. Do we divide into those who go to church and those who dont? Why do people go to church at all? Is it habit? Is it because their parents went? Or why do some people not go to church but still think of themselves as Christians?

Perhaps it comes down to what does it mean to be a Christian. For some it is living a good life, trying to do the right thing, following a list of rules. For others it is about reading scripture and trying to apply the lessons they learn there in the world. For others it is about making the world a better place by transforming unjust structures and showing their care for others. We could also talk about it in terms of being a prayerful person, who spends time listening to what God is saying and seeking His presence in the world. There are other ways to multintudinous for me to list but all have their root in knowing God and acknowledging Him.

When we gather to worship we are giving honour to God who is at the heart of our faith. We may find that our worship encourages and sustains our faith as we live our lives. It may be a place of learning through sermons. It should also certainly be a place of fellowship where we can meet and encourage our fellow believers. Hopefully also a place of evangelism where we can invite our friends and family to come to know more about God.



Advent and Christmas Services

On Sunday 8th December at 6.30pm we begin our preparations for Christmas with our Advent Carol Service at Chippenham. The service begins in almost darkness and through a progression of choral music, hymns and readings we move to the church being fully lit up to symbolise the light which the Christ child brings to the world. This service will be sung by the joint choirs of Chippenham and Fordham

Christmas can be an ambiguous time. Everything suggests we should be joyful, but, for any number of reasons, that may be difficult. So on Saturday 21st December at 4pm we will have our Quiet Christmas Service. The celebration of Communion is at the heart of the life of our church and at Christmas we share this 11.00am on Christmas Day. As always all Christians are welcome to join us in sharing bread and wine to celebrate His birth.
